It is designed to show information about the quality of the healthcare we provide, our workforce and volunteers, community partnerships, and our financial health. We plan to update this Scorecard every quarter with the latest information about our programs and services.

are fine-tuning our Level 3, nationally recognized patient-centered medical home to operate more efficiently, improve access, and provide better services to our patients. For example, Patient Visit Availability in our Balanced Scorecard is a measure of accessibility to medical providers for our patients. It shows that on average established patients have same-day access to appointments.

As a federally-qualified health center (FQHC), we are held to high standards of care related to the clinical services we provide. In our Scorecard, 86% of our federal **Clinical Measures** have improved during 2014 as compared to 2013. We provide quality care to our patients!

An area of importance for us this year is our **Community Partnerships**. We partner with patients to improve their health. Donor partners over the years have been unwavering in support of our service to patients. Working with public, private, and nonprofit organizations demonstrates how interconnected we are as a community. Our Scorecard shows we have over 800 partners supporting our Mission. Thank you!
